



Governor Phil Bredesen joined TDOT Commissioner Gerald Nicely and state and local leaders on August 25

to announce the award of a \$291,752 transportation enhancement grant to the City of Tullahoma for the Tullahoma Downtown Revitalization Project.

The grant was a collaborative effort between the Tullahoma Pride Committee and City staff members, with the support of the Board of Mayor and Alderman.

The project will include replacement of deteriorating sidewalks in the downtown section of E. Lincoln Street and the construction of new concrete ramps and decorative brick stamped crosswalks. The existing landscaping will be replaced with improved island plantings of trees and shrubs that compliment the greenway system and the downtown business district. New pedestrian lighting will be added along the sidewalks, while existing overhead wires will be relocated underground. A new section of greenway will be installed adjacent to History Park along E. Lincoln Street, which will serve to connect the city park to the greenway system and form a new trailhead for the system. This is Phase I of the revitalization project.

Spread the word: City of Tullahoma Small Business Loans

The City of Tullahoma was awarded a \$199,000 grant from USDA Rural Development for small business loans. Low interest rate loans are available primarily for capital improvements and equipment purchases, in amounts of \$5,000 to \$15,000.

To be eligible, a business must be located in the City of Tullahoma, have less than 50 employees, and annual revenues under \$1 million. Interest rates are set at 4% below prime, adjusting annually, with up to five years for repayment terms. Loan payments are returned to the program's revolving loan fund.


Tullahoma Recycling Program



Public Works offers recycling service to Tullahoma residents. Residential curbside recycling is collected from home addresses weekly coinciding with regularly scheduled garbage collection days. Containers are available at Public Works, 942 Maplewood Ave.

Please sort and bag items per category below. Remove caps and lids and break down corrugated cardboard. Place recyclables curbside by 6:00 a.m. on the morning of your pick-up.

- Plastic
- Aluminum cans
- Tin and bi-metal food cans
- Newsprint
- Corrugated cardboard



- Household hazards waste collection is held once a year, usually around May.
- Tires can be dropped off Thursdays at Coffee County Rural Solid Waste, located at 2180 Murfreesboro Hwy, Manchester. Call 723-5139 for more information.
