

## Tullahoma Historic Zoning Commission Districts



Did you know that back in February 2005 the Tullahoma Historic Zoning Commission proposed establishing six Districts within the Town Plan of Tullahoma? This action established the names and boundaries for the historic districts and did not cause restrictions to be imposed on any of the properties. Outlined in the above map are the Depot District, the College District, Old Town District, the Public Square District, the Big Springs District, and the Downtown District.

In the last year, action groups have formed in the Downtown and the Old Town Districts which consist of merchants, business owners, and property owners in these areas. They are focusing on ways to improve and bring business to their areas.
